Dr. Laura Ford spoke recently about reproductive rights and Project 2025 at the Walloon Lake Winery.

Laura Ford of the Charlevoix County Democratic Party recently spoke to more than two dozen attendees from Charlevoix County. Her talk, titled The 411 on Reproductive Health and Political Activism," was held at the Walloon Lake Winery in Petoskey and sponsored by the Charlevoix Women Democrats. Laura was a nurse practitioner in women's health with more than 40 years in clinical practice and was an adjunct instructor on health policy and law at Western Michigan University.

What can voters to maintain freedoms? Ford urged the group to stay aware, to try to educate themselves and inform others, to evaluate with "reason and integrity," and to vote Blue to preserve America's freedoms.



In Michigan, 32 Election Deniers serve in the state legislature, making up **21**% of the 148-person body and part of the leadership in both chambers. In the Michigan House of Representatives, **22** Election Deniers make up **20**% of the chamber. **None** ran unopposed last election, and **9** were new to the chamber in 2023.

In December 2020, Jack Bergman was one of 126 Republican members of the House of Representatives to sign an amicus brief in support of *Texas v. Pennsylvania*, a lawsuit filed at the United States Supreme Court contesting the results of the 2020 presidential election, in which Biden defeated Trump.

On January 6, 2021, Jack Bergman voted **NOT** to certify the election results.

THE MICHIGAN SUPREME COURT

In Michigan, the People elect their Supreme Court justices.

To have your vote counted, you must individually cast your vote in the <u>non-partisan section</u> of your ballot. Stright ticket voting does not include the non-partisan section.

The Michigan Democratic Party nominated two candidates running this year:



Kimberly Ann Thomas

Thomas <u>is a law professor</u> at the University of Michigan Law School, where she teaches civil and criminal litigation and runs the Juvenile Justice Clinic.



Kyra Harris Bolden Incumbent

Bolden, of Southfield, was <u>nominated to the</u> <u>court by Gov. Gretchen Whitmer</u> in November 2022 to replace former Justice McCormack. She is running for reelection to serve out the remainder of McCormack's term, which expires Jan. 1, 2029.

Letters to the Editor – General Writing Guidelines

- Focus on ONE timely/newsworthy issue
- Be clear & concise
- Make your point in 1st sentence & build from there; end with a repetition of the main point
- Plan that 1st sentence carefully; make it short & interesting
- Keep letter short; there are usually strict word limits
- Keep sentences short & to the point
- Use short, simple words
- Be factual & cite reference sources when appropriate
- Avoid being antagonistic or hostile to anyone; absolutely no vulgarity
- When supporting a candidate, use their name frequently throughout letter; avoid even saying the
 opponent's name (refer to as 'our current representative'; 'his/her opponent'; 'the current administration',
 etc)
- Most Editors limit letters to 2 situations: 1) Local topics, written by anyone & 2) Letters by local residents on (most) any topic
- Don't send form letters

Submission Guidelines

- Look for & follow submission guidelines, usually found on paper's website
- Always provide your contact information; papers typically call to verify authorship

Why Letters Are Still A Useful Advocacy Tool

- Most newspapers publish them in print & online
- Good letters are 'a voice in the community' & 'give voice to those without a voice'
- Editors use letters to seek out local stories &/or guest opinion writers
- Still one of the few ways for regular citizens to have their voices heard
- Letters are also read by decision makers, local councilmembers, and midlevel bureaucrats
- There's value in providing readers with an idea of what people in the area are saying & thinking
- One caveat: Most letter readers/writers skew towards the over-50 generation; younger readers are more
 apt to read the shorter comments that appear beneath articles on digital websites

Ways to Make It Fun

- Form a letter-writing group!
- Meet together to discuss topics & strategies
- Offer writers editorial assistance; help them sharpen message
